Colonel Daryl A. Chamberlain serves the Director for the Joint and Combined Warfighting School, Joint Forces Staff College, National Defense University, in Norfolk, Virginia. He is originally from Livonia, Michigan and currently lives in Chesapeake, Virginia.

Colonel Chamberlain graduated from the United States Military Academy in 1998 and was commissioned as a Second Lieutenant in the Adjutant General Corps of the Army. After five years of service in the Regular Army, he transitioned to the Army Reserve in 2003 and, subsequently, entered the Active Guard and Reserve program in 2004 where he has served in an Active Duty status ever since. In 2005, he deployed with the XVIII Airborne Corps helping to establish the Multi-National Corps-Iraq Army Reserve Affairs office. His subsequent assignment history includes command positions as a Captain, Major, and Lieutenant Colonel, serving as an operations officer for Human Resources Command-St. Louis, the Secretary of the General Staff for the 311th Signal Corps (Theater), and the Office Management Director for U.S. Central Command J6. His most recent assignment was serving as the Director of the Chief of Army Reserve's Action Group.

Colonel Chamberlain's military education includes the Joint Advanced Warfighting School, Joint and Combined Warfighting School, the Canadian Forces' Joint Command and Staff Programme, the U.S. Army Command and General Staff Officers' Course, and the U.S. Army Adjutant General Advanced and Basic Officer Courses. He is a certified Senior Human Resources Professional, a Lean Six Sigma Green Belt, and an Army Parachutist.

He is currently pursuing a Doctorate in Strategic Leadership from Liberty University. He earned a Master of Science in Campaign Planning and Strategy from the Joint Forces Staff College as well as a Master of Arts in Human Resources Management from Webster University.
